II. Zechariah's Opening Address (1:1-6)

## A. The Young Prophet's Superscription with Date (1:1)

- 1. Following the Jewish calendar "the eighth month of the second year of Darius" would be between late \_\_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_\_ BC.
- 2. The phrase "the word of the Lord came to Zechariah" reveals the \_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_\_ of this prophetic book. (2 Pet. 1:20-21)

## B. Zechariah's Earnest Warning and Call to Repentance (1:2-6)

- 1. The prophet stated emphatically that Jehovah had been angry with Judah's forefathers; this was a fact that \_\_\_\_\_\_ of them could \_\_\_\_\_\_ because they had personally \_\_\_\_\_\_ divine judgment. (v. 2)
